#### STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY

#### **UT RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS**

"In residence" refers to courses taken at UT Austin; it does not include credit by exam, extension, or distance education courses. All of the following must be completed in residence:

- At least two long semesters or an equivalent period of time.
- · A total of 60 hours.
- 24 hours in Business, on a letter-grade basis.
- 12 upper-division hours, on a letter-grade basis, from the major coursework.
- 24 of the last 30 hours.

## SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY, PART I

Six hours in a single field of study.

The following courses may be counted:

Additional courses:

- Astronomy 302, 303, 307 (Only one of Astronomy 301, 302, 303, or 307 may be counted. Astronomy 309Q may not be paired with 309N or 309R.)
- Biology 311C, 311D, 416K, 416L, 315H, 325H (It is recommended that students complete one of the following pairs of courses: Biology 311C and 311D, or Biology 416K and 416L, or Biology 315H and 325H.)
- Chemistry 301, 302, 301H, 302H, 313N, 314N (It is recommended that students complete one of the following pairs of courses: Chemistry 301 and 302, or 301H and 302H, or 313N and 314N.)
- Geological Sciences 401, 303, 404C, 405, 305E, 420H (Only one of Geological Sciences 401, 303, or 420H may be counted. Geological Sciences 404C may not be paired with 405.)
- Natural Sciences 306J, 306K, 306L
- Physics 301, 302K, 302L, 303K, 303L, 316, 317K, 317L (It is recommended that students complete one of the following pairs of courses: Physics 301 and 316, or 302K and 302L, or 303K and 303L, or 317K and 317L.)

### **SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY, PART II**

Three hours in a field of study <u>different</u> from the field counted toward Science & Technology Part I.

## **3 ADDITIONAL HOURS**

Three hours must be fulfilled by one of the following courses:

- Psychology, Sociology, Anthropology. The only courses within each dept. that will not count are those that deal primarily with statistics and data processing (i.e. PSY 418, SOC 317L, SOC 317M).
- Fine Arts. Any course from the following departments: Archaeology, Architecture, Art History, Studio Art, Visual Art Studies, Classic Civilization, Latin, Greek, Fine Arts, Music, Ensemble, Instruments, Philosophy (except logic and argument courses), Theatre & Dance.
- Visual & Performing Arts. See list above.
- Upper-division coursework completed in an approved study abroad program.

#### CRITERIA FOR THE OPTIONAL MINOR

- Students may complete one minor. The minor may be business or nonbusiness.
- Twelve hours in a single field with at least nine hours being upper-division.
- One core business course or one basic education course may be used toward the minor. The Internship course may not be counted toward the minor.
- Six of the hours for the minor must be taken in residence.
- Courses for a minor must be taken on a letter grade basis unless they are only offered on a pass/fail basis.
- Students must meet the prerequisites and other department restrictions placed on courses for the minor.
- Specific course requirements exist for a minor in MIS or FIN.
- Accounting students who minor in Economics may use ECO 420K in addition to either ECO 304K or 304L and two additional upper-division Economics courses for their minor.
