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Dr. Ross Jennings is a Professor of Accounting and Chairman of the Department of Accounting at the University of Texas McCombs School of Business, where he has taught for 20 years, including a year at the *Pontificia Universidad Catolica de Chile* in Santiago, Chile. He has conducted research on a wide range of topics in financial accounting, including the usefulness to investors of accounting information related to inventory, goodwill, depreciation, research and development, inflation accounting in Latin America, and alternative computations of earnings per share. His research has been published in leading scholarly journals in accounting, including *The Accounting Review*, the *Journal of Accounting Research*, the *Journal of Accounting and Economics* and the *Review of Accounting Studies*.

Professor Jennings has taught classes to students at all levels, including undergraduate students in business, master's students in both accounting and business, doctoral students in accounting, and both financial and non-financial executives. He has recently taught classes in financial reporting and financial statement analysis to full-time students in Texas and to executives in the United States, Mexico, Europe and Asia. His recent experience also includes developing and delivering custom executive education programs for organizations as diverse as Dell, Motorola, Vought and the U.S. Navy. Professor Jennings has received numerous teaching awards including the Texas Excellence in Teaching Award and the CBA Foundation Advisory Council Award for Teaching Innovation, and the Fawn & Vijay Mahajan Teaching Excellence Award for Executive Education. He has also been named to the University of Texas Academy of Distinguished Teachers.
