**CIBER Summer Study Abroad Programs
Scholarship Application**

Eligibility: The CIBER Summer Scholarship program is designed to encourage students of The University of Texas at Austin to incorporate a study abroad experience to their academic education. Eight scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 each will be awarded across the CIBER-sponsored programs listed below, approximately two scholarships per program. Any student who is working towards a UT-Austin degree and is planning to participate in one of these programs is eligible to apply for a CIBER Summer Scholarship. Students do not need to be enrolled in the program at the time of submitting the CIBER scholarship application.

Criteria: Scholarships will be awarded on a combination of academic merit and financial need. Recipients will receive notification of the award by November 18, 2005, and will be required to confirm acceptance of the award (and submit a \$500 non-refundable enrollment deposit for the program of their choice) by December 2, 2005. Awardees are required to maintain good academic standing and must continue making satisfactory progress toward their degrees. Awardees are required to serve as representatives of the McCombs School of Business/CIBER Summer Study Abroad Programs over the following academic year. Awardees that choose not to participate in one of the CIBER-sponsored summer programs during 2006 will forfeit their scholarship, but are eligible to apply the following year. Awardees who withdraw from the program will automatically forfeit their scholarship. Should a program be cancelled, awardees will be granted an opportunity to enroll in another CIBER-sponsored summer program and transfer the scholarship towards the program fee, or forfeit the scholarship award.

This report must accompany your application. **Note to International Students:** although you are not eligible by federal law to file the FAFSA, you must provide documentation of financial status similar to that required for the FAFSA, if you wish to be considered for this award. Such documentation includes official income documentation (tax return) from your family or sponsor in your home country.

These items should be submitted in a total package, not in separate parts. The CIBER Scholarship Committee may defer consideration of incomplete applications. **Reminder:** All applications must be submitted **no later than 5:00pm on November 4, 2005**.
